## TENSION

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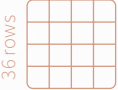







It is essential to work to the stated tension in order to achieve the desired fabric and garment size. You should always start by knitting a tension square before knitting the full garment.

If you have fewer stitches than stated, you will need to go down needle sizes until the correct tension is achieved. If you have more stitches, you will need to go up needle sizes. Please check individual patterns for tension before starting your garments.

## FINISHING AND MAKING UP

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We recommend using mattress stitch for seaming your project. Once your project is complete, it is essential to block your knitting. Pin your garment out to the size stated in the pattern, cover with a damp cloth and leave to dry.

## Measurements

### Full Length (approximately measured from side of back neck)

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## Equipment

One pair of 2.75mm (UK12/US2) knitting needles.  
and/or one 2.75mm (UK12/US2) 60cm long circular  
knitting needle.

One pair of 3.25mm (UK10/US3) knitting needles.  
and/or one 3.25mm (UK10/US3) 60cm long circular  
knitting needle.

Two stitch holders.

## Tension

28 sts and 36 rows to 10cm measured over stocking  
stitch and pattern on 3.25mm needles or size needed  
to achieve stated tension.

**It is essential to work to the stated tension to  
ensure success.**



## Back and Front (both alike)

Using 2.75mm needles or circular needle,  
cast on 111 [125:141:155:169:183:197:211:225] sts.

**Row 1 (RS):** K1, \*P1, K1, rep from \* to end.

This row sets moss-stitch and is repeated.

Cont in moss-st until work measures 3cm from  
cast on edge, ending with **WS** facing for next row.

**Dec row:** P to last 3 sts, P2tog, P1.  
110 [124:140:154:168:182:196:210:224] sts.

**Change to 3.25mm needles or circular needle**  
and proceed as follows:

**Row 1 (RS):** K7 [7:8:6:6:6:4:4:4], (K1, P1, K5)  
0 [1:2:0:1:2:0:1:2] times, (K1, K2tog, yfwd, K7, P1, K6, P1, K5)  
4 [4:4:6:6:6:8:8:8] times, K1, K2tog, yfwd, K1, (K5, P1, K1)  
0 [1:2:0:1:2:0:1:2] times, K7 [7:8:6:6:6:4:4:4].

**Row 2:** P7 [7:8:6:6:6:4:4:4], (K1, P6) 0 [1:2:0:1:2:0:1:2] times,  
(K1, P2, K1, (P6, K1) twice, P5) 4 [4:4:6:6:6:8:8:8] times, K1,  
P2, K1, (P6, K1) 0 [1:2:0:1:2:0:1:2] times, P7 [7:8:6:6:6:4:4:4].

**Row 3:** K7 [7:8:6:6:6:4:4:4], (K1, P1, K5) 0 [1:2:0:1:2:0:1:2]  
times, (K1, yfwd, sl1, K1, pssso, K7, P1, K6, P1, K5)  
4 [4:4:6:6:6:8:8:8] times, K1, yfwd, sl1, K1, pssso, K1,  
(K5, P1, K1) 0 [1:2:0:1:2:0:1:2] times, K7 [7:8:6:6:6:4:4:4].

**Row 4:** P7 [7:8:6:6:6:4:4:4], (K1, P6) 0 [1:2:0:1:2:0:1:2] times,  
(K1, P2, K1, (P6, K1) twice, P5) 4 [4:4:6:6:6:8:8:8] times, K1,  
P2, K1, (P6, K1) 0 [1:2:0:1:2:0:1:2] times, P7 [7:8:6:6:6:4:4:4].

These 4 rows set pattern and are repeated.

Cont in patt (throughout) as set until work measures  
29 [29:29:29:30:31:31:33:34]cm from cast on edge,  
ending with **RS** facing for next row.

### Shape Armholes

**For 3<sup>rd</sup>, 4<sup>th</sup>, 5<sup>th</sup>, 6<sup>th</sup>, 7<sup>th</sup>, 8<sup>th</sup> and 9<sup>th</sup> Sizes Only**

Cast off – [-:6:8:8:11:11:13:14] sts in patt at beg of next  
2 rows. – [-:128:138:152:160:174:184:196] sts.

### All Sizes

Cast off 6 [7:6:8:9:11:12:13:14] sts in patt at beg of next  
2 rows. 98 [110:116:122:134:138:150:158:168] sts.

**Next row:** K3, sl1, K1, pssso, patt to last 5 sts, K2tog, K3.

**Next row:** P3, P2tog, patt to last 5 sts, P2togtbl, P3.  
94 [106:112:118:130:134:146:154:164] sts.

Rep last 2 rows 1 [1:1:1:1:1:2:2:3] times more.  
90 [102:108:114:126:130:138:146:152] sts.

**Next row:** K3, sl1, K1, pssso, patt to last 5 sts,  
K2tog, K3. 88 [100:106:112:124:128:136:144:150] sts.

**Next row:** P4, patt to last 4 sts, P4.

Rep last 2 rows 1 [2:2:2:3:3:3:4] times more.  
86 [96:102:108:118:122:130:138:142] sts.

Keeping 4 sts at each end as set in st-st and  
working in patt where there are full 'vertical lines'  
or in st-st if not, cont until armhole measures  
17 [19:21:23:24:25:26:27:28]cm, ending with **RS** facing  
for next row.

### Shape Neck

**Next row (RS):** Patt 13 [17:20:22:27:27:31:34:36] sts,  
turn and leave rem 73 [79:82:86:91:95:99:104:106] sts  
on a holder.

Working each side of neck separately.

Work 1 row.

Work 2 rows dec 1 st at neck edge on both rows.  
11 [15:18:20:25:25:29:32:34] sts.

Work 4 rows dec 1 st at neck edge in next and foll  
alt row. 9 [13:16:18:23:23:27:30:32] sts.

Work 2 rows more without shaping.

### Shape Shoulder

**Next row (RS):** Cast off 4 [6:8:9:11:11:13:15:16] sts  
in patt, patt to end. 5 [7:8:9:12:12:14:15:16] sts.

Work 1 row.

Cast off rem 5 [7:8:9:12:12:14:15:16] sts in patt.

With **RS** facing, working on rem  
73 [79:82:86:91:95:99:104:106] sts, slip centre  
60 [62:62:64:64:68:68:70:70] sts on a holder  
for centre of neck, **rejoin yarn** to rem  
13 [17:20:22:27:27:31:34:36] sts and patt to end.

Work 1 row.

Work 2 rows dec 1 st at neck edge on both rows.  
11 [15:18:20:25:25:29:32:34] sts.

Work 4 rows dec 1 st at neck edge in neck and foll  
alt row. 9 [13:16:18:23:23:27:30:32] sts.

Work 3 rows more without shaping.



### Shape Shoulder

**Next row (WS):** Cast off 4 [6:8:9:11:11:13:15:16] sts in patt, patt to end. 5 [7:8:9:12:12:14:15:16] sts.

Work 1 row.

Cast off rem 5 [7:8:9:12:12:14:15:16] sts in patt.

### Neckband

Join right shoulder seam.

With **RS** facing and **using 2.75mm needles or circular needle**, pick up and K8 sts evenly down left side of front neck, K across 60 [62:62:64:64:68:68:70:70] sts from front neck holder, pick up and K8 sts evenly up right side of front neck, 8 sts evenly down right side of back neck, K across 60 [62:62:64:64:68:68:70:70] sts from back neck holder and pick up and K7 sts evenly up left side of back neck.

151 [155:155:159:159:167:167:171:171] sts.

Work 7 rows in moss-st as set on Back and Front.

Cast off in patt.

### Armhole Borders (both alike)

Join left shoulder and neckband seams.

With **RS** facing and **using 2.75mm needles**, pick up and K127 [141:163:169:191:207:215:229:239] sts evenly around armhole edge.

Work 7 rows in moss-st as set on Back and Front.

Cast off in patt.

### Making Up

Join side and armhole border seams.

Weave in ends and pin your garment out to the size stated in the pattern, cover with a damp cloth and leave to dry.
